	Algebra II Review #0531	5	1	This course is for students who need a comprehensive review of Algebra II in order to be prepared for higher-level math, to fulfill SMHS graduation, and/or college admissions requirements.	Required for students earning a 1 <sup>st</sup> or 2 <sup>nd</sup> semester grade of F or students who earn a grade of D in 2 <sup>nd</sup> semester and wish to continue in math
	Math Bridge #0559	0	2	This course is designed for incoming freshmen in need of additional reinforcement of math skills in preparation for high school Math courses.	Mandatory for incoming SMHS freshmen whose admissions letters indicate that this class is required

<b>NON-DEPARTMENTAL</b>	ESLR Portfolio	1	1	This course is for seniors who did not complete the ESLR Portfolio requirement for graduation. ESLR Portfolio must be taken during the summer of the senior year. If it is not taken during the summer after senior year, the class will not be offered until the following summer. A diploma will not be granted to any senior who has not completed the ESLR Portfolio requirement.	Daily attendance is required until all of the missing work is completed.
	Freshman Prep for Success	5	1	This course is open to all incoming freshmen wanting to improve study, organizational, and communication skills, critical thinking and creativity and problem solving. Students will take learning style, career and college interest surveys to assist in goal setting.
